Application Instructions

Eligibility Criteria

To be considered for the Troop 17 Scholarship, all applicants must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- Have reached the age of majority in their province or territory of residence;
- Be enrolled in a full-time accredited Canadian college or university;
- Demonstrate they have made significant efforts in preventing bullying and harassment in their schools and/or communities; and
- Explain how they continue to promote anti-harassment principles in their schools and/or communities.

Assessment

Applications will be assessed based on:

- The creativity and originality of the initiative;
- The overall impact and/or results in the school and/or community; and
- The clarity of thought, and quality of writing in the application.

Applications will be reviewed by the RCMP's National Gender and Harassment Advisory Committee. The selected applicants will be recommended to the RCMP Commissioner for final approval. Please note that only successful applicants will be notified.

Submission

Application packages must be completed in full. Incomplete applications will not be considered. The following are required for an application to be considered complete:

- Application form 6513
- Proof of post-secondary registration (can be sent later but due before August 31st)
- Reference 1 (submit separate form 6514 for Reference 1)
- Reference 2 (submit separate form 6514 for Reference 2)
